



Letter from the Chairman

For eight decades, North Carolina's Alcoholic Beverage Control System has delivered three important benefits to the people of North Carolina: control, service and revenue.

Control

Each year, laws related to our regulatory processes change marginally. However, what we have in place in 2017 is essentially the same control system North Carolina has relied on since the Commission was established in 1937. In the last 80 years, as North Carolina has grown, so has the ABC system. Today, 167 ABC boards operate 428 stores that sell bottles of spirituous liquor to individual consumers or businesses in North Carolina. The state's warehouses stock more than 2.400 different liquors that the local ABC boards are able to order. In the last fiscal year, the warehouses shipped nearly 6 million cases, averaging approximately 111,000 cases a week and 23,000 cases per day to the local boards.

Service

At the conclusion of the last fiscal year, 68 distilleries, 194 wineries and 254 breweries held permits to operate in North Carolina. (Fifty-two of these North Carolina distillers were in active production and shipping bottles during the fiscal year.) In addition to these commercial permits and those

required for industry representatives, the ABC Commission issued permits regulating more than 18,000 retail businesses.

During fiscal year 2017, the Commission

has enhanced its online portal so businesses may provide audit reports and other required documentation online. The Commission provides free training to sellers and servers across the state, both online and in person, regarding the laws related to alcohol. Last year more than 13,000 individuals received alcohol seller and server training in physical classes and online. The Commission has continued the award-winning Talk it Out campaign to emphasize the importance of parents talking with their children about the dangers of underage drinking.

Revenue

In the last fiscal year, sales at ABC stores once again broke records, and once again exceeded one billion dollars. Those sales of \$1,068,773,846 generated distributions to state and local governments totaling \$406,044,410.

The increased revenues and profitability of the local ABC boards may be attributed to many causes, including increased operational efficiency. In fiscal year 2017, the ABC Commission staff completed the initial round of performance audits of

the local boards. When the Commission launched the performance audit process in 2012, board profitability improved from 86 percent of all boards operating profitably in 2011 to 96 percent generating profitable revenue today. In the new fiscal year, Commission staff is beginning a second round of audits and revisiting all 167 boards in the system. The Commission is working as a partner with the boards to further improve operations and compliance with ABC laws and regulations.

Application fees, renewals and registrations during the last fiscal year generated \$24.9 million for the state's General Fund. The agendas for the Commission's regular meetings included 1,061 cases of businesses in violation of ABC laws and regulations, or an average of 88 cases each month. Financial penalties paid by permit holders that violated ABC laws generated \$1.67 million distributed to the public schools in the communities where the violations occurred.

A Solid Foundation

The North Carolina ABC Commission serves the people of the state well, and I am proud to serve as its Chairman. Commissioner Mike Herring and I invite you to review the operations of North Carolina's ABC system for fiscal year 2017, which are summarized in this annual report.





With its staff of approximately 50 employees, the Commission oversees a uniform system of control over the sale, purchase, transportation, manufacture, consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in the state as outlined in the state law.

By statute, the ABC Commission is responsible for

- Administering the ABC laws
- Providing for enforcement of the ABC laws
- Setting prices of spirits sold in ABC stores
- Determining brands of alcoholic beverages sold in the state
- Serving as wholesale distributor of spirituous liquor
- Contracting for state ABC warehousing of spirituous liquor
- Overseeing local ABC Boards
- Issuing ABC permits
- Imposing sanctions against businesses holding ABC permits that violate the law
- Promulgating rules

Immediately prior to the business portion of the March 2017 meeting of the North Carolina Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission, Chairman Guy took the oath of office as head of the statewide agency. In doing so, he joined Commissioner Mike Herring on the panel that conducts the business of the agency each month. Chairman Guy previously had served on the Commission from 2009 through 2013 and was Chairman from 2012 through 2013.

I am honored Governor Roy Cooper has asked me once again to lead the ABC Commission as chairman. I know first-hand that the Commission staff are focused on applying North Carolina's laws and regulations professionally, and they work hard every day to serve the best interests of the citizens of our state,

During fiscal year 2017, the North Carolina Initiative to Reduce Underage Drinking extended its work in key areas with its signature outreach, the Talk it Out Campaign, as well as work with community coalitions and partnerships.

Here are some highlights.

The Initiative has partnered with state agencies, including the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Health and Human Services. the Department of Public Instruction, the Governor's Highway Safety Program, the Department of Insurance, the Department of Administration, Alcohol Law Enforcement. the Administrative Office of the Courts and the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Coalitions

As of fiscal year 2017, more than 100 community coalitions have joined with the Initiative to help spread the Talk it Out campaign message across the state.

Community Meetings

To help promote awareness of the campaign, Initiative staff participated in 73 local community meetings during the year to introduce the Talk it Out campaign concept and acquaint participants with available resources.

Speakers' Bureau

The Initiative manages a Speakers' Bureau that features a list of pre-screened speakers from North Carolina (both parents and children) whose lives have been directly impacted by underage drinking tragedies. During fiscal year 2017 the speakers delivered 38 presentations across the state.

Brain Development Module

The Initiative again worked with the Department of Public Instruction to produce a comprehensive instruction module for teachers. The course focused on brain development as it pertains to growth, maturity, emotional, behavioral, and academic issues for North Carolina's K-12 students.

High-Liability Server Trainings

During 2017, the Initiative partnered with local coalitions and DMV to conduct seller/server training programs in college communities around the state as a supplement to the North Carolina ABC year-round responsible service training course (RASP).

Statewide Partners

The Initiative has formed 21 statewide partnerships with representatives from the education, first responders, law enforcement, and medical communities that publicly have endorsed the Talk it Out campaign.



Digital Resources

Some of the Initiative's most well-known awareness components during the fiscal year included the Talk it Out ads, videos, and clips, which play on TV, on-line, and on the radio statewide. In addition, the Talk it Out YOUTUBE channel presented videos featuring Duke Men's Basketball Head Coach Mike Krzyzewski, Duke Women's Basketball Head Coach Joanne P. McCallie, and NCSU Women's Basketball Head Coach Wes Moore.

Fake ID Program

Using a grant from the North Carolina Governor's Highway Safety Program, the Initiative staff collaborated with law enforcement, DMV, and researchers to address key issues related to fake IDs.







Shown above and at right is ABC Commission Director of Local Board Audits and Pricing Laurie Lee leading training sessions held in Nashville, Winston-Salem and Elizabeth City. ABC Commission staff delivered board training at 11 different sites across the state during the spring of 2017.

Employees of the state's 167 local ABC boards handle the sale of liquor at retail stores throughout the state. In order to ensure that board employees are up-to-date on laws, rules and best practices, ABC Commission staff conduct performance audits and also provide training across the state.



ABC Boards opened five stores during the fiscal year, and communities across the state held a wide range of alcohol votes as noted in the tables at right. In addition, the General Assembly approved the "Brunch Bill," which allows local jurisdictions to enact ordinances to allow the sale

of beer, wine or mixed beverages as

early as 10 a.m. on Sundays.


